TIGER SCHOLARSHIP



Maryland International School (MDIS) is providing a scholarship opportunity for the High School Classes of 2022 & 2023. As an IB World School, in addition to earning a high school diploma, students entering as Juniors can earn up to 30 college credits and an IB Diploma. Students entering as Seniors can earn up to 15 IB credits in addition to their high school diploma.

IB challenges students to take part in programs of education that can lead them to some of the highest-ranking universities around the world. At Johns Hopkins University, students typically earn more college credits for an equivalent score on an IB exam than an AP exam, and at the University of Maryland credits can be up to twice as much. At Towson University, students who earn an IB Diploma could be awarded 30 units toward their bachelor's degree and receive sophomore standing.

Scholarship Details:

- **Tiger Scholarships will be awarded on a rolling basis, however, the deadline for submissions is August 20, 2021.** Scholarships awards range from \$5,000 - \$12,000.
- To apply for a Tiger Scholarship, you must:
 - Be eligible to enroll in Grades 11 or 12 for School Year 2021-2022
 - Submit your **MDIS Application** & required documents to apply@marylandinternationalschool.org.
- Tuition credit is not redeemable for cash or transferable and will never result in payment of any kind. Scholarship money can only be applied towards MDIS tuition.

Tackle a Global Issue

You are a researcher gathering information on a country of your choice and one of the **17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG)** that proves to be problematic in the country.

You will present your findings on the country's struggle with achieving the goal you have selected to research. Your slide deck can be created using Google Slides or Prezi.

Your Slide Deck/Prezi must include the following:

1. Current map of the country you are researching.
2. Statistics related to the SDG you selected to research (i.e. If you are doing Goal 4: Education Equality, you may choose to provide information on how much of the country's population is currently educated/without access to education).
3. Information about how the country is currently struggling with or has struggled with improving the SDG goal.
4. A brief overview of the efforts and movements being implemented to meet this SDG.
5. Conclude your presentation with the 500-word essay requirements detailed below.

Essay Requirements:

The last slide of your slide deck/Prezi must include the following:

- 500-word essay that details your reflection on what you have learned and addresses the following questions:
 - What is the role of international organizations in tackling global issues?
 - How can organizations such as the UN or UNICEF or CDC or WHO or Red Cross make a difference?
 - Your reactions to what you have learned (with specific details - statistics, etc.)
 - How can you take action and make a difference in this situation? [i.e. protest, raise money, raising awareness (making presentations, getting involved in the local community, campaigns)].
